

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR VEIN DOCTOR









What types of vein treatments does your Doctor offer?

- At Vein Doctors Group we have the most comprehensive suite of modern treatments for varicose veins in the legs and pelvis. You are guaranteed the most suitable modality of treatment for your individual needs; as opposed to just getting the treatment that your doctor may be most comfortable in offering.
- Our treatments consist of ultrasound guided, foam, sclerotherapy, endovenous ablation, radio frequency ablation, medical adhesives, as well as pelvic vein coiling using fluoroscopy for pelvic vein congestion syndrome.



- Follow up is as important, if not more important, than the one initial procedure that your Doctor may quote you for.
- An expert vein Doctor will offer you treatments that go beyond just
 a laser or radio frequency treatment with some stripping. The most
 complex part of the treatments are the follow up with precise injection
 sessions to manage all the branching veins and the spider veins. Failure
 to do this follow up treatment expertly, results in complications such as
 blotchy veins (telegiantatic matting) and pigmentation that detracts from
 the cosmetic results that women, in particular, are seeking and why they
 originally decided to have treatment.
- If you have had previous treatments and you have been told that pigmentation and blotchy telangiectatic or "matty" veins that detract from visual and symptomatic improvement cannot be improved, then see Vein Doctors Group for a second opinion. It is common in our practice (over 50% of cases) that patients have had previous treatments performed with other specialists and are not happy with the results, yet in most of those patients we can significantly improve their outcomes.

Is your Doctor knowledgeable and are they able to manage the full scope of vein and lymphatic conditions?

An expert in the field is capable of managing not only leg veins, but also pelvic veins, venous malformations, and lymphatic conditions.

Is your Doctor comprehensively trained in the modern techniques?

- The Australasian College of Phlebology is multidisciplinary and a fellowship with this College assures at least 4 years of specialisation in these modern modalities. Training through the College includes face-to-face, hands on training with a supervising Doctor as well as filing log books and completing primary and advanced practical and written exams. Ask your Doctor how comprehensive their training is and how much hands-on, practical, supervised training and examinations were involved.
- Furthermore, did your Doctor do advanced training or a fellowship specifically for vein treatments including hands-on ultrasound use? Or have they just completed training via external or distance education with little supervision or practical, supervised training or exams? Or in a specialised field where very little modern venous work is part of the curriculum?

Does your Doctor understand the science behind injection techniques?

- Modern injection techniques involve small aliquots of solution to optimally seal off diseased veins including the whole system of deeper (non-visual) and surface diseased veins. A very methodical approach to injections means multiple, smaller dosed injections with high accuracy using the ultrasound rather than just a few nominal injections into the obvious visible veins.
- Traditional injections are usually on surface veins and 5-6 nominal injection points where the solution is deactivated and ineffectual throughout the whole vein system, which in actual fact causes complications including blood clots, pigmentation and matting.



Is your Doctor part of an expert peerreviewed group such as the Australasian College of Phlebology, as well as an accredited group of peers internal to their own organization, such as the Medical Advisory Committee that exists at Miami Private Hospital & Specialist Centre (for Vein Doctors Group)?

If your Doctor is not part of an internationally recognized peer-based group, please research the credibility and founders of their Institute or Academy, to ensure it is not a self-established Institute or self-appointed membership. Please ask your Doctor if their College membership is nominal (i.e. membership through payment of a fee) or if is it a result of a full comprehensive training and admission to the College as a respected Fellow.





Does your Doctor use ultrasound guidance for consults and treatments?

- Ultrasound is the mainstay for modern venous treatments (nonstripping) although these are considered recent advances, our Doctors have been using these techniques for over 25 years, making our team the most experienced.
- Ultrasound provides a full real-time picture to enable safe and targeted treatment of the underlying causes whilst avoiding damage to nerves, arteries and skin. Unlike superficial treatments, which treat only the visible veins, and inevitably fail.
- The cause of your vein disease is fully investigated by ultrasound during consult, as well as during procedures, to ensure complete treatment to maximise results, minimise recurrences and avoid complications.
- By documenting the medical causes of venous disease, the treatment using Medicare and Health Funds is justified. Further intricate deep vein and arterial pathology in the leg is assessed, when required.
- You are ensured optimal safety with an independent, qualified sonographer supporting the treating doctor during your treatment.



Does your Doctor operate within a Purpose Built or Licensed Facility offering a range of rebate opportunities including Medicare and Private Health?

 Miami Private Hospital & Specialist Centre is licensed by Queensland Health and has the highest level of accreditation underpinned by a full medical advisory committee to scrutinize the credentialing of every Doctor that works in the facility. As opposed to non-accredited outpatient facilities and clinics with no criteria



- for Doctor credentialing. The Hospital is also certified by council as a class 9 building that conforms to all safety requirements.
